

## Classic Components Conflict Minerals Policy Statement



Classic Components Corporation, as a global independent distributor of electronic components, peripherals and IT products, has acknowledged our corporate responsibility to comply with the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act that was signed into law on 7/21/2010. The Dodd-Frank Act applies to certain operations with requirements to disclose any use of raw materials that contain minerals sourced from mines located in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and/or neighboring countries. These minerals which include tantalum, tin, tungsten and gold are frequently used in electronic components.

As an independent distributor, Classic Components is unable to certify country of origin of minerals used by original component manufacturers of products that we distribute. However, we actively support the paradigm of transparency in the supply chain, including publication of mineral traceability data on the public domain.

Organizations such as the ECIA and OECD are currently working to achieve better awareness of this policy worldwide and to make available relevant data on the public domain for greater compliance.

Classic Components does not directly purchase conflict minerals from smelters and does not knowingly procure any product containing conflict minerals from the conflict region. In addition, Classic's value-added services do not include manufacturing or re-manufacturing of components or finished products that would necessitate the use of conflict mineral raw materials.
